Lesson 4 - God's Kingdom Is the Church

Isaiah 2:2-3

2 And it shall come to pass in the last days, that the mountain of the LORD'S house shall be established in the top of the mountains, and shall be exalted above the hills; and all nations shall flow to it. 3 And many people shall go and say, Come, and let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; and he will teach us his ways, and we will walk in his paths: for out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem.





state



The kingdom was not here in Acts 1, but in Acts 2, it identifies this time as the beginning of the Last Days when God said that He would set up His kingdom, and Christ the king is now sitting at the right hand of God on His throne which indicates that He is ready to rule His kingdom.

Acts 2:36-38, 41, 47

36 Therefore let all the house of Israel know assuredly, that God has made that same Jesus, whom you have crucified, both Lord and Christ. 37 Now when they heard this, they were pricked in their heart, and said to Peter and to the rest of the apostles, Men and brethren, what shall we do? 38 Then Peter said to them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Definitions:

Assuredly: without fail

Pricked: to bring pain

to the mind

Remission: removal

In Acts 2, God added those who were being saved to the church. This is the first place in the Bible that the church is mentioned as being in existence. The church started here, but what about the kingdom?

The Church is the kingdom. Here are some ways that we can know this is true.

1 Timothy 3:15

But if I tarry long, that you may know how you ought to behave yourself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth. The Church is the house of God. God said in Isaiah that He would build His house in the last days, and in Daniel He said He would build His kingdom at this same time.

Matthew 16:18-19

18 And I say also unto you, That you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hades shall not prevail against it. 19 And I will give to you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: and what ever you shall bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and what ever you shall loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.

Definitions:

Tarry: wait to come

Prevail against: to overpower

Loose: to unbind

Jesus said He was going to build His church, and also give the keys of the kingdom to Peter.

We use keys to get into things. In Acts 2, Peter is the one to tell the people how to get into the church. This is one way we are able to see that the church and the kingdom are the same thing.

These are a few more examples of connecting the church as the kingdom.

Matthew 25:1

Then the kingdom of heaven shall be likened to ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom.

In describing the kingdom, Christ is compared to a bridegroom and the church is referred to as the bride of Christ.

Chaste: to be pure from every fault

2 Corinthians 11:2

For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy: for I have espoused you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ.

John 3:5

Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God.

Baptism is when we are born again to enter the kingdom and for God to add you to the church.

Acts 2:41, 47

41 Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them

47 praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved.

Acts 2:2-4 And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and *one* sat upon each of them. 4 And they were all FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Acts 2:16-17a But this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 17 'And it shall come to pass in the LAST DAYS says God, that I will POUR OUT OF MY SPIRIT ...

Acts 2:14 But Peter, standing up with the eleven, raised his voice and said to them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in **JERUSALEM**, let this be known to you, and heed my words....

Acts 2:38, 41, 47 Then **PETER** said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins ...

41 Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them. 47 praising God and having favor with all the people. And the **LORD ADDED TO THE CHURCH** daily those who were being saved

(Peter told the people what they needed to do to be added to the kingdom, the Lord's Church.)

God promised a Kingdom that would come at the time of the Romans that would last forever. It happened as He said.

The church that Christ built which is the Kingdom of God began in Jerusalem, 50 days after Christ was resurrected (33AD).

That Kingdom, the Church that belongs to Christ, is here today.
