Lesson 6 - Worship of the Church

Acts 20:7

And on the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached to them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight.

To break bread refers to the Lord's Supper. When Jesus set up the Lord's Supper, He broke the bread and blessed it (Matthew 26:26).

1 Corinthians 11:18-26

18 For first of all, when you come together in the church, I hear that there are divisions among you; and I partly believe it. 19 For there must also be heresies among you, that they which are approved may be made manifest among you. 20 When you come together therefore in one place, this is not to eat the Lord's supper. 21 For in eating every one takes his own supper before others: and one is hungry, and another is drunken. 22 What? Do you not have houses to eat and to drink in? or you despise the church of God, and shame them that do not have? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you in this? I praise you not. 23 For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered to you, That the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread: 24 And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me. 25 After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, This cup is the new testament in my blood: this do you as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me. 26 For as often as you eat this bread, and drink this cup, you do show the Lord's death until he comes.

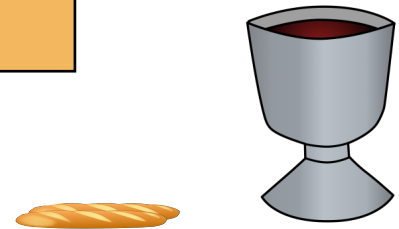

Going back to when Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper, Paul teaches us to do what Jesus did each first day of the week. There are no different instructions in the New Testament about this memorial feast. Therefore, the church uses only these things when remembering Christ's sacrifice each Sunday.

Speaking one to another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your heart to the Lord;

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.

The musical instrument created by God, which is the human voice, can fulfill all the commands in the New Testament concerning music in the church. The mechanical instruments made by man cannot do any of the things God commands in worship to Him.

Christians are to all sing to each other. In worship to God, no one can sing for another person. The Bible says nothing about choirs. The melody is to be made in our hearts. So, it does not matter how good our voice is. Jesus never commands the church to play an instrument. Therefore, like the human body, His body cannot do what Jesus did not tell it to do.

1 Corinthians 14:34

Let your women keep silent in the churches: for it is not permitted for them to speak; but they are commanded to be in submission, as also the law says.

In this context, Paul is talking about speaking and teaching one at a time. In this place, God says women are not to do so. Therefore, women can sing with everyone as demonstrated on the page before, but not speak nor lead in the worship.

Earlier in 1 Corinthians 11:2-16, Paul talks about head coverings being worn by women. He ends this discussion in verse 16 with this: “But if anyone seems to be contentious, we have no such custom, nor do the churches of God.” Head coverings were a problem only because of the culture. It is not something that matters in the church. He makes no such statement about women speaking in the worship. This is how we know that this command for women to be silent in the church is not connected with the time period.

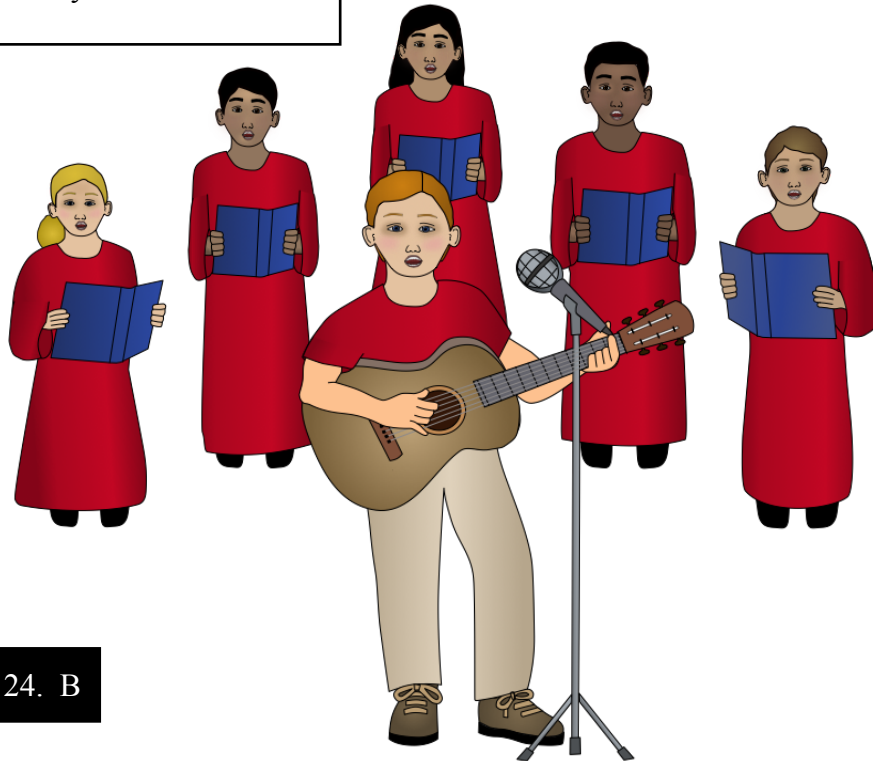

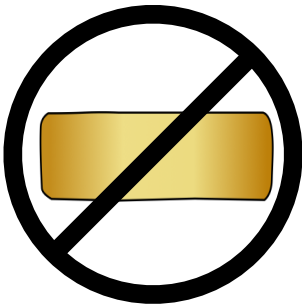
