6 For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. 7 For scarcely for a righteous man will one die: yet maybe for a good man some would even dare to die. 8 But God commended his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. 9 Much more then, being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him. 10 For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life.

Titus 2:11

For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men,

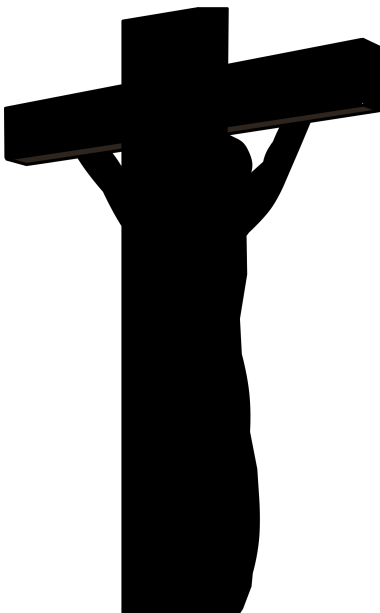

James 2:14-19, 24

14 What does it profit, my brethren, though a man says he has faith, and does not have works? Can faith save him? 15 If a brother or sister is naked, and destitute of daily food, 16 and one of you say unto them, Depart in peace, be warmed and filled; but you do not give them those things which are needful to the body; what does it profit? 17 Even so faith, if it does not works, is dead, being alone. 18 But, a man may say, you have faith, and I have works: show me your faith without your works, and I will show you my faith by my works. 19 You believe that there is one God; you do well: the demons also believe, and tremble.

24 You see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by faith only.

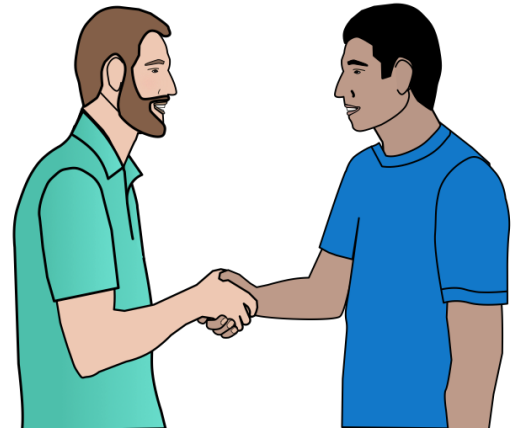

Being sorry for our sins is not repentance. To repent, we must realize that we are living against God, and that we must change our behavior. Repenting is when a person is doing or thinking something, and when they realize they are wrong, they change their behavior.



After believing that Jesus truly is the Son of God, Saul no longer wanted to fight against Him. When Saul went into the city, he did not persecute the Christians. This is a great example of repenting. Repentance is necessary to be right with God. However, when Saul was talking to Jesus, he asked what he should do. Jesus told him to go into the city and he would hear something he must do. Next, we will read what Saul was told.

Acts 9:8-11

8 Then Saul arose from the ground, and when his eyes were opened he saw no one. But they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. 9 And he was three days without sight, and neither ate nor drank. 10 Now there was a certain disciple at Damascus named Ananias; and the Lord said to him in a vision, "Ananias." And he said, "Here I am, Lord." 11 So the Lord said to him, "Arise and go to the street called Straight, and inquire at the house of Judas for one called Saul of Tarsus, for behold, he is praying. . ."

In Acts 22:12-16, Saul is telling what happened to him.

12 "Then a certain Ananias, a devout man according to the law, having a good testimony with all the Jews who dwelt there, 13 came to me; and he stood and said to me, 'Brother Saul, receive your sight.' And at that same hour I looked up at him. 14 Then he said, 'The God of our fathers has chosen you that you should know His will, and see the Just One, and hear the voice of His mouth. 15 For you will be His witness to all men of what you have seen and heard. 16 And now why are you waiting? Arise and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on the name of the Lord.'

Definitions:

Arose: stood up

Sight: able to see

Inquire: ask for information

Devout: very religious man

Testimony: good report

Saul believed that Jesus was God's Son, he spent three days fasting and praying. Ananias had not yet come. No one had told him what to do yet. When Ananias came, he told Saul to be baptized so that his sins would be washed away. Nothing Saul had done before Ananias had come took his sins away. He had to choose to be baptized before God would cleanse him of his past sins.

3 Do you not know, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? 4 Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into his death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. 5 For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection: 6 Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, we should no longer serve sin.

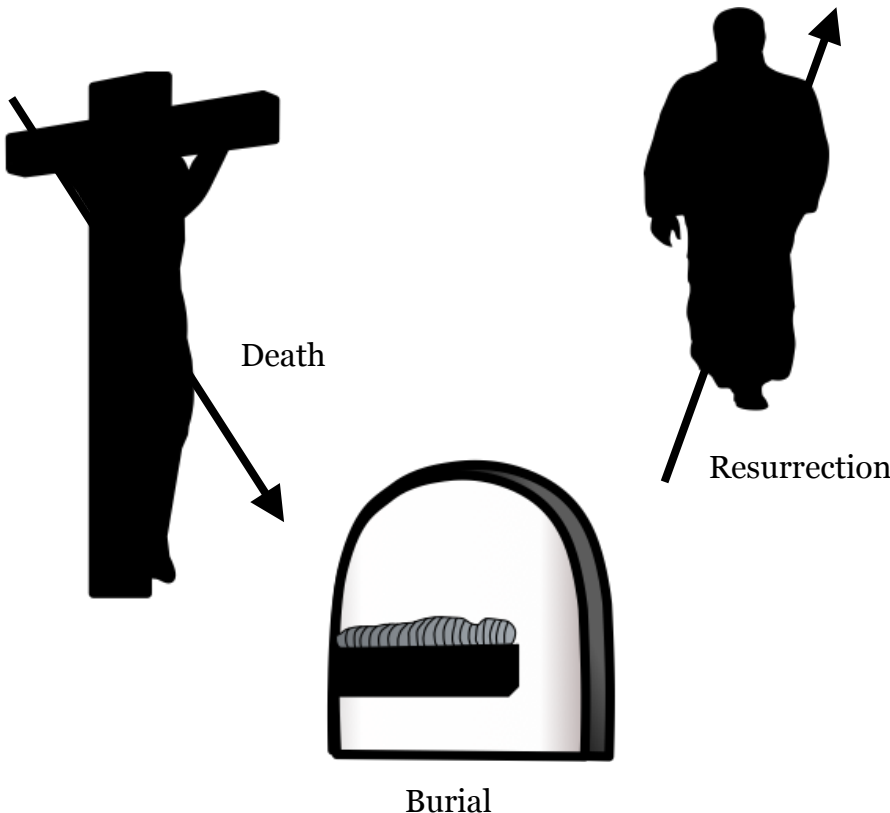

Nothing man can do would ever cause God to have to save us. We are saved by His grace. However, He gives man the choice to accept or reject this grace through obedience. Jesus makes it clear that first we must believe, repent, and confess that He is the Son of God. Then we must submit in baptism where God cleanses our sins and makes us new again. God is the One who does the saving by removing our sins. Our obedience simply shows our love for God and our desire to be saved.
