Words to Remember

In **Hebrews 4:9** it reads, *There remains therefore a rest for the people of God.* We have been given a promise that we will have an eternal rest away from sickness, death, and pain. This place where we will rest forever is called heaven. The Hebrew writer makes a connection between the sabbath and heaven. There remains a day when God's people will enter a "sabbath rest". This is like the sabbath for the Jew but this rest will be eternal in heaven. If we want to enter the sabbath rest then there are some things that we need to do.

We need to be diligent, **Hebrews 4:11** Let us therefore be diligent to enter that rest, lest anyone fall according to the same example of disobedience. The author of Hebrews tells the audience that if they want to enter that rest they must do something. What must they do? They must "be diligent" or strive. There is work that must be done to enter the rest. A person must labor to be paid. We must work to have rest. **2 Timothy 2:15** [ESV] says, *Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth.* We must do our best to be approved by God.

We must do our best to rightly handle the Gospel. We must do the work, **Hebrews 4:10** For he who has entered His rest has himself also ceased from his works as God did from His.God has promised that if we will do the work then the rest will come. A day will come when we will rest from the work of this life.

We must hold fast our Confession: **Hebrews 4:14** Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. One of the major themes of Hebrews is the priesthood of Jesus. Coinciding with this is Christ's role as a mediator between

us and God the father. Christ speaks on our behalf and defends us against the accusations of the Devil. For this reason we should not neglect the confession which we have given, **Matthew 10:33**. The confession being the belief in Jesus which we learn from the Gospel.
